# Introduction

Compliance with external regulatory bodies further ensures that we meet national standards for inclusivity and safety.

**How do we know?** Dedicated staff maintain close contact with international students, ensuring their distinct needs are addressed promptly. Culturally specific support services and orientation programs receive regular feedback from international learners, which is used to enhance service delivery and meet their wellbeing requirements.

Information accuracy and clarity are regularly reviewed to ensure prospective learners have the resources they need to make informed decisions.
